DEFINITIONS

"Beginner" A member who has not won a first prize at any fuchsia show, except in classes

7, 11, 12 and 33 to 37.

"Intermediate" A member who has not won a first prize at any fuchsia show, except in classes

1 to 7, 11, 12 and 33 to 37. An intermediate can remain in this section

indefinitely even after winning a first place in this section.

"Full standard"

"Half standard"

"Quarter standard"

"Mini standard"

Stem not less than 30" (76cm) nor exceeding 42" (107cm).

Stem not less than 18" (46cm) nor exceeding 30" (76cm).

Stem not less than 10" (25cm) nor exceeding 18" (46cm).

Stem not less than 6" (15cm) nor exceeding 10" (25cm).

(Dimensions refer to the clear stem from the soil to the lowest branch).

All pots can contain one or more plants with the exception of class 11, 12, 26 and 27

All pots must be of a full standard size and terracotta in colour. Exceptions - Hanging pots and Bonsai.

The diameter of a pot is the inside measurement made as near to the top as possible, but excluding any part of the roll or rim.

SHOW REGULATIONS

 Classes are only open to paid-up members, of at least three months standing, of The Northampton and District Fuchsia Society.

- 2. Exhibitors may have two entries in each class with the exception of classes 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 17, 18 and 28 to 32 where only one entry is allowed.
- All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor and been in his or her possession for three
 months.

They must be shown in the final size pots in which they have been grown and staged on the saucer provided. Plants to be named where possible.

 Newcomers to exhibiting may enter the beginners' classes and progress through to the intermediate classes on achieving a first place win in the beginners.

Entrants in the intermediate classes may remain in the intermediate section indefinitely even with a first place win in this section.

A beginner or intermediate member winning class 7 is not required to move up a class. If any member enters the open classes and achieves a first place they are not eligible to enter the beginners or intermediate classes - a beginner or intermediate member winning the society plant classes 11 or 12 is exempt from this ruling.

- 5. Baskets must be of an open mesh construction and be commercially manufactured as baskets. When exhibiting half baskets, the use of a framework to increase the height or width is prohibited. Full baskets must be able to be hung at eye level. All baskets are to be top planted only.
- It is prohibited to cut back growing shoots of a plant to a set of buds or flowers to improve its shape.
 Any plant so found will not be eligible for an award. Rogue shoots may be cut well back inside the flowering surface.
- All semi-double varieties should be included in the single classes. Variegated foliage exhibits should have foliage having two or more colours.
- 8. Plants should be pest and disease free. The Show Secretary is empowered to remove plants.
- Closing date for entries: Wednesday before the show. Late entries will only be accepted at the discretion of the Show Secretary if circumstances allow.
- 10. Staging can take place on Friday from 1.30pm to 8pm and Saturday 7.00am to 8.30am.
- 11. No plants to be removed from the show bench before 5pm on Saturday.
- 12. Exhibits are shown at the owner's risk. The Society cannot be held responsible for loss.
